







Device Requirements

<p>Windows Tablet or 2-in-1</p>		<p>A Windows device that has a touch screen.</p> <p>Apple devices (iPads/Macs) and Android tablets are NOT supported by our school network due to issues with support and security.</p> <p>A minimum hard drive of 64 GB. Any additional space, even by adding an SD card, is worthwhile.</p>
<p>Operating System</p>		<p>Windows 10 or 8.1 or 8 or 7</p>
<p>Stylus</p>		<p>Best - device with <u>active digitiser</u> Not as good - device with capacitive screen</p>
<p>Protective Case</p>		<p>Students need to take care of their equipment to ensure that the tablet remains in good working order.</p>
<p>Headphones</p>		<p>Essential in a number of classes that require students to listen to audio without disturbing others.</p>
<p>Portable Charger</p>		<p>Preferably something with at least 10000mah capacity. Many students often lose their device's charge before the end of the day.</p>
<p>Extended Warranty</p>		<p>Most devices come with one year warranties. It is highly recommended that you seek extended warranties with your supplier.</p>
<p>Accidental Damage Protection</p>		<p>This is also highly recommended – especially with cracked screens.</p>
<p>Anti-virus Software</p>		<p>Any antivirus software is acceptable so long as it is regularly updated. There are several free programs available (AVG, Avast, etc.)</p>

Any downtime due to damage or reliability issues will seriously affect students' productivity in the classroom. It is essential that devices have adequate cover that allows for a quick turnaround.



Please note that it would be OK to use a Windows laptop **only** if it were to be used with a graphics tablet - [approximately \\$120+](#).

An external keyboard (usb, wireless or bluetooth) is not essential but may be used. There are issues with portability and desk space.

Parents are able to purchase a suitable tablet from any vendor of their choice.
